Rise at Warren Legacy Supporter

Residence House Naming Rights

Rise at Warren's campus will be anchored by six 4,000 square foot beautiful residential houses, each home to six residents, situated in a horseshoe around a walking trail. Each residence house will contain four 1-bedroom suites and one 2-bedroom suite.

For those interested in supporting a residence house, these yet-to-be-named houses provide the opportunity for donors to create a permanent legacy where their name can not only display prominently on the high visibility exterior signage but also become synonymous with welcoming all of its residents and visitors for years to come.

Individual Suite Naming Rights

Within each residence house, individual suites offer donors a more intimate place to reflect their generous gift, with signage on the door to the suite they choose to sponsor. Each of the 30 residence suites will provide a peaceful sanctuary to unwind after a long active day, featuring a private bedroom and bathroom.

 This naming opportunity is valued at \$50,000 per suite.



Community Building Naming Rights

The 9,500 square foot Community Building will be the most prominent building on campus, achieving high visibility and high daily foot traffic from residents and non-residents. Anchored at the top of the campus horseshoe, this building will serve as the daily centerpiece of the community by housing various offices and state-of-the-art therapeutic, wellness, and social areas.

Given its importance and assortment of offerings, the Community Building presents a variety of naming opportunities for donors interested in leaving their mark on the community.

• Naming rights to the entire Community Building (via large signage that will be visible from Mountain Avenue) is valued at \$3,000,000.

Further Details on the Residences

In addition to its living quarters, each residence house will feature a comfortable outdoor wrap-around porch. Inside each house will be a communal kitchen, family room, and laundry rooms. Residence houses will provide endless learning opportunities in social and daily skill-building. State-of-the-art safety and technology features will be installed throughout each home. For example, each resident will wear a key fob bracelet that gives access to their own house and personal suite that is preprogrammed to their own abilities (e.g. stove usage, water temperature) and can be adjusted as a resident learns new skills. Safety technology will also be linked to common household hazards with automatic off ability to all ovens, water temperature control, washer/dryers, thermostats, etc.
